## Introduction to 1997/1998 Index

Some notes are necessary for users of this index.

First, in 1994, as a result of the Electoral Boundaries Commission, 27 single member districts with Members of the Legislative Assembly (MLAs) replaced the 32 dual member districts comprised of Councillors and Assemblymen, though the changes did not take effect until the first session after the election of November 18, 1996. The following pages list the names of the districts and the members representing them.

Second, in the original publication of the bound Hansard for the First Session of the Sixtieth General Assembly, pages 96-105 are repeated as pages 106 through a portion of 115. Due to this repetition, certain page numbers will not appear in the index. (See Errors and Omissions, below.)

Third, on pages 257 through to 298 inclusive, the header is incorrect. It currently reads 26 APR 1997, but should read 26 MAR 1997. We have indexed using the correct date.

Fourth, from 31 March 1998 through to the end of 2 April 1998, the page numbers as used by Hansard at the time are 3586 through to and including 3703. An error was made. 31 March 1998 is correctly numbered 3586 to 3658; however, all of 1 April 1998 and a portion of 2 April 1998 are numbered as 3586 to 3658. Correct numbering resumes on page 3659 (2 April 1998). For the purposes of the index, and to make it decipherable for the pages that are duplicated in number, Hansard is renumbering the pages as follows: 3586-2, 3587-2, 3588-2, etc. This pagination format was adopted up to and including the last duplicate page 3658-2, at which point normal pagination resumes, e.g., 3657-2, 3658-2, 3659, 3660. The normal pagination continues until pages 3702 and 3703 are reached. Those page numbers are repeated with different information on the page, so the second instance of repeated pages will appear in the same format, e.g., 3702-2, 3703-2. The note at the foot of the affected pages in the bound Hansard for the 1st Session of the 60th General Assembly is not present in the online edition; it is safe to ignore it.

Fifth, 5 June 1998 terminates on page 5946 and 9 June 1998 commences on page 5948. The page number 5947 has been omitted in both the Green Bound edition of Hansard and the Blue Bound edition; therefore, it does not exist and there will be no references to it made in the index. (Online, however, because of the differences in pagination, 5 June 1998 terminates on 5951, while 9 June still commences on page 5948, resulting in the duplication of four page numbers, and the inclusion of page 5947, which, as mentioned before, does not exist in the bound editions.)

Keeping in mind the above mistakes and difficulties, users are advised to check also the Errors and Omissions section that follows. That gives a more detailed description of both minor and major errors found in the Green Bound Hansard, the Blue Bound edition, and, at times, the online version.

## Errors and Omissions

The 1997-1998 Green Bound edition of Hansard was used to create a more usable index. During the process various errors were noted, but the document was not proofread with an eye to catching these. Some errors may remain unnoted as they lie outside the ambit of the index project. Hansard apologizes for these errors.

**11 March 1997:** There are two pages missing, 16-17, which have now been photocopied and inserted into Hansard's Green Bound edition from the Blue Bound edition.

**13 March 1997:** In the original publication of the bound Hansard for the First Session of the Sixtieth General Assembly, pages 96-105 are repeated as pages 106 through to a portion of 115. Due to this repetition, page numbers 106 through to 114 will not appear in the index.

**13 March 1997:** There are two pages numbered 147 in the Green Bound edition, but the information is repeated, so it does not interfere with the functionality of the document or the index. This repetition does not occur in the Blue Bound edition.

**18 April 1997:** There are two pages missing, 834-835, which have now been photocopied and inserted into Hansard's Green Bound edition from the Blue Bound edition.

**25 April 1997:** There are four pages missing, 1072-1075, which have now been photocopied and inserted into Hansard's Green Bound edition from the Blue Bound edition.

**29 April 1997:** There are two pages missing, 1126-1127, which have now been photocopied and inserted into Hansard's Green Bound edition from the Blue Bound edition.

**27 May 1997:** Pages 2049-2050 are repeated twice. It does not interfere with the functionality of the document or the index. The error does not occur in the Blue Bound edition.

**29 May 1997:** There are two pages missing, 2262-2263, which have now been photocopied and inserted into Hansard's Green Bound edition from the Blue Bound edition.

**29 May 1997:** There are two pages missing, 2268-2269, which have now been photocopied and inserted into Hansard's Green Bound edition from the Blue Bound edition.

**9 December 1997:** There are smears obliterating the words on Hansard's copy of the Green Bound edition, pages 3031, 3034. Also, about one inch from left margin of the book there is a line extending through the type that obscures some of the letters and numbers. It is found throughout the text, but has been noted specifically on pages 3001-3042 and throughout this volume.

**10 December 1997:** There are smears obliterating the words on Hansard's copy of the Green Bound edition, pages 3043, 3046, 3055, 3058, 3067, 3070, 3081. Also, about one inch

from left margin of the book there is a line extending through the type that obscures some of the letters and numbers. It is found throughout the text, but has been noted specifically on pages 3043-3081 and throughout this volume.

**11 December 1997:** There are smears obliterating the words on Hansard's copy of the Green Bound edition, pages 3093, 3096, 3105, 3108, 3120. Also, about one inch from left margin of the book there is a line extending through the type that obscures some of the letters and numbers. It is found throughout the text, but has been noted specifically on pages 3082-3146, and throughout this volume.

**27 March 1998:** There are two pages missing, 3552-3553, which have now been photocopied and inserted into Hansard's Green Bound edition from the Blue Bound edition.

**31 March 1998:** From 31 March 1998 through to the end of 2 April 1998, the page numbers as used by Hansard at the time are 3586 through to and including 3703. An error was made. 31 March 1998 is correctly numbered 3586 to 3658; however, all of 1 April 1998 and a portion of 2 April 1998 are numbered as 3586 to 3658. Correct numbering resumes on page 3659 (2 April 1998).

To make the index decipherable for the pages that are duplicated in number, Hansard is renumbering them (for 1 April 1998): 3586-2, 3587-2, 3588-2, etc. This pagination format was adopted up to and including the last duplicate page 3658-2 (2 April 1998), at which point normal pagination resumes, e.g., 3657-2, 3658-2, 3659, 3660. The normal pagination continues until pages 3702 and 3703 are reached. Those page numbers are repeated with different information on the page, so the second instance of repeated pages will appear in the same format, e.g., 3702-2, 3703-2. The note at the foot of the affected pages in the bound Hansard for the 1st Session of the 60th General Assembly is not present in the online edition; it is safer to ignore it.

**15 April 1998:** There is a discrepancy between the online version of Hansard (taken from the daily sheets) and the bound edition concerning a request for editing by an hon. member. The error and request for correction are present in the online version of the Hansard, but in the bound version the error has been corrected, while the request for correction is still present.

The problem resulting from the corrected bound edition is that the request for correction (15 April 1998 page 3945) no longer refers to anything. The initial mistake was made on the cover page of 14 April 1998, and also on page 3842, where Mildred Dover was referred to as Dr. Mildred Dover. Because of the discrepancy in pagination of the online version, the error appears on page 3843 online. The error needs to be reinserted or a note needs to be made on page 3842 in the bound edition in order to clarify the issue.

**16 April 1998:** The bottom left corner of page 4043 looks as though it was not scanned correctly, and it is missing the beginning of some of the words. The same page from the Blue Bound edition looks fine, and has been inserted into the Green Bound edition.

**28 April 1998:** There is a discrepancy between the online version of Hansard (presumably taken from the daily sheets) and the bound edition concerning a request for editing by an hon. member. The error and request for correction are present in the online version of the Hansard, but in the bound version the error has been corrected, while the request for correction is still present.

The problem resulting from the corrected bound edition is that the request for correction (28 April 1998 page 4380) no longer refers to anything. The initial mistake was made on 17 April 1998, page 4090, where Chester Gillan used the word “tenured”, misinterpreted by Hansard staff as “tendered”. Mr. Gillan requested to have the error changed, but now that it has been, his request for change no longer refers to anything. Because of the discrepancy in pagination of the online version, the error appears on page 4091 online. The error needs to be reinserted or a note needs to be made on page 4090 in the bound edition in order to clarify the issue.

**19 May 1998:** There are twelve pages missing, 5096-5107, which have now been photocopied and inserted into Hansard’s Green Bound edition from the Blue Bound edition.

**19 May 1998:** There are six pages missing, 5392-5397, which have now been photocopied and inserted into Hansard’s Green Bound edition from the Blue Bound edition.

**29 May 1998:** There are two pages missing, 5555-5556, which have now been photocopied and inserted into Hansard’s Green Bound edition from the Blue Bound edition.

**3 June 1998:** There are two pages missing, 5675-5676, which have now been photocopied and inserted into Hansard’s Green Bound edition from the Blue Bound edition.

**5-9 June 1998:** 5 June 1998 terminates on page 5946 and 9 June 1998 commences on page 5948. The page number 5947 has been omitted in both the Green Bound edition of Hansard and the Blue Bound edition; therefore, it does not exist and there will be no references to it made in the index. Online, however, because of the differences in pagination, 5 June 1998 terminates on 5951, while 9 June still commences on page 5948, resulting in the duplication of four page numbers, and the inclusion of page 5947.
