

## HOW LAWS ARE MADE

### FIRST READING

*The bill is introduced and a brief explanation is provided without any debate.*

### SECOND READING

*Members debate the object or purpose of the bill, called the principle of the bill.*

### COMMITTEE STAGE

*The bill is examined clause by clause in a Committee of the Whole House in which all Members participate. The results of the Committee of the Whole house debate are reported to the Assembly.*

### THIRD READING & PASS

*Members debate the potential effect of the bill and vote on whether it should pass.*

### ROYAL ASSENT

*The Lieutenant Governor assents to the bill in the name of His Majesty the King, at which point the bill becomes law unless otherwise directed in the bill itself.*



The Assembly sits twice a year, once in the spring and once in the fall. The public is welcome to view the debates from the public galleries in the Chamber, on the right-hand side inside the door, and on the far left in front of the windows. Seating is limited, so be sure to arrive early!

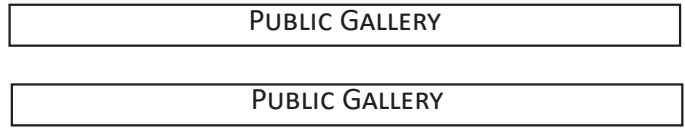
SEATING PLAN FOR THE FLOOR
